

## Regional GIS

Wednesday, May 27, 2020 a virtual Mid-Shore GIS Committee meeting was held. Representatives from the ESRGC, Town of Denton, Caroline County, City of Cambridge, and Talbot County were present.

### Topics/Discussion:

All counties and municipalities are continuing to work through the COVID-19 pandemic. Markin Sokolic from Talbot County reported all COVID-19 related work is being handled through Emergency Management. Mark Cohoon, the County's GIS manager, is currently working with Emergency Management and not available for the meeting.

The Town of Denton is closed to the public and the staff is working a rotational schedule. Donna Todd has not directly been tasked with supporting the Town's COVID-19 needs. Many projects have been delayed due to the current working conditions, including the Town's comprehensive plan and an urban tree survey with the ESRGC.

The City of Cambridge reports working mostly on Engineering needs, including Miss Utilities and construction inspections.

Caroline County supports the needs of the County and emergency operations.

The ESRGC presented two new dashboards related to COVID-19. Anastassiya presented the ESRGC's COVID-19 20-day trend dashboard of cases in Maryland. Brett reviewed the Ventilator Dashboard for the group. Erin shared updated to the Delmarva Index, Economic Dashboard, DLLC Story Map, and poultry house data updates.

Scott Warner updated the group on upcoming fiscal year 21 projects including RMPIF, economic resiliency, and economic development tools.
